## Howard County Code of Ordinances—Parking in a cul-de-sac

### Section 21.221 (a)(18)

(a) Except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic, or in compliance with law or directions of a Police Officer or traffic control device, an individual may not stop, stand, or park vehicle:

(18) Adjacent to the center island of a cul-de-sac

This is not a Covenant. This is a matter for the Howard County Department. You must call the police or notify the Police, so they may issue a traffic citation. The Howard County Police Department non-emergency number is: 410-313-2200.

The Village is sponsoring a paper document shredding event for our residents. You must be a resident of Dorsey's Search and you must show ID before you shred. Paper document shredding is for documents that have personal information. Junk mail which does not contain your name and address can be put in your recycling can. This is for residential use, not for commercial business.

Special events are sponsored by the Dorsey's Search Community Association and some events may be co-sponsored with the Villages of Columbia and/or Dorsey's Search Village Merchants and Columbia Association. For those events requiring a ticket, tickets can be picked up at Linden Hall during regular business hours. For most events, there are a limited number of tickets available, so tickets are distributed on a first-come, first served basis. **No telephone reservations can be taken unless otherwise noted.** Tickets must be picked up in advance-there are no tickets available at the door, since caterers need an exact headcount before hand. **If you picked up free tickets and cannot attend an event, please return to the village office as soon as possible so you can be taken off the headcount and allow a wait-listed family to attend.** Staff may require ID in order to verify residency; please do not send children to pick up tickets, since they are not included on the resident list. Family or Children's events must have an adult accompanying a child. Tickets may still be available when the newsletter is being printed, but may be sold out before you receive your issue. Please feel free to call us to see if there are still tickets available. Thank you.

The Howard County Bureau of Highways is responsible for pavement, sidewalks, storm drains, trees, and over 970 miles of county roads for the convenience and safety of the public. If you see a problem within the village please call the appropriate number below or use the TellHoCo App that can be downloaded onto your cell phone. **Traffic Engineering Division**...This division is responsible for traffic signals, streetlight installation, street signs, and traffic calming and safety. 410-313-2430.

**Street Signs**...The Sign and Marking Division is responsible for all existing street signs and pavement markings. To report damaged or down sign, contact 410-313-7450. To inquire about the installation of a new sign, contact 410-313-2430.

**To Report a Highway Maintenance** concern such as road condition, **sidewalks**, storm drainage or street trees, contact the Highways Operations Division at 410-313-7450 or by email: [highways@howardcountymd.gov](mailto:highways@howardcountymd.gov).

**Bulk Trash Items**: Residents receiving County-provided curbside trash collection are eligible for curbside bulk trash and metal collection. Residents in private areas that do not receive County collection are not eligible for bulk pickup. Remember: Bulk trash items collected by the County will be sent to a landfill. Residents may call 410-313-6444. Large trash items (individual items which do not fit in trash cans) such as mattresses, box springs, chairs, sofas, dressers and tables will be collected. Place these items at the curb on your regular trash day. Maximum of 4 large trash items will be collected per pick-up. Items must be able to be lifted by two collection crew members (larger items will be tagged and left for the resident's disposal). Bulk metal items include metal swing sets, file cabinets, appliances, lawn mowers, exercise equipment, etc. must be scheduled. Please remove doors from refrigerators, and drain oil and gas from lawn mowers. Please go to:

# Dorsey Hall Garden Club

*"Spring...an experience in immortality. Henry D. Thoreau (1817-1862)*

Last month, The Dorsey Hall Garden Club made over 30 teacup arrangements and delivered them to the *Morningside House Assisted Living Center* in Dorsey Search. The arrangements were primarily in yellow and white accented in fresh greenery. Daisies, Altamira, and Baby's Breath created a bright and sunny counter to the gray days of late February and the staff and residents were happy to receive them.



I recently read that this year is another year for the Cicada. This is an unusual event, since it will be the emergence of 2 Cicada broods, XIX and XII. This occurs every 221 years, when the 13-year Cicada, XIX merges with the 17-year Cicada, XII. The last time the two broods emerged at the same time was in 1803 and won't reemerge together until 2245. The regions affected in Maryland will be scattered and we will most likely see the XIX Broods in our area.

Although Cicadas often cause trepidation due to their sheer numbers, their loud, high pitched mating sounds and their bright red eyes, it is good to remember that Cicadas are harmless. They do not pose a risk to garden plants. If you do have young trees, they could potentially damage them when the insect cut into their branches to lay their eggs. I recommend covering young trees with netting with small enough holes not to pose a risk to birds. There are many birds and other animals that eat insects and will feast on this year's abundant crop of Cicadas. So, remember the immergence of these unpleasant insects are all part of nature's food-chain and a benefit to us all.

## Spring Home Maintenance
