(4765 Dorsey Hall Drive, Ellicott City). You must pick up your plant. The Village cannot keep your plant at the community center. If you participated in the previous plant giveaway, this plant will be larger. At our last giveaway, the plants were a quart size. We hope those quart size plants are flourishing. We look forward to offering a one gallon size for this event.

We are working with Columbia Association (CA) and the Dorsey Hall Garden Club to determine the best native plants for our Village.

In addition to the plant giveaway on Saturday, September 14, the Dorsey Hall Garden Club will be on hand to answer gardening questions and membership inquires. Maryland Master Gardeners will have a table during this event to further assist our residents with any questions.

We encourage interested residents to fill out and return a completed form to the Village Office *immediately*.

We only have 200 plants. First 200 residents will receive a free plant.

**Cardinal flower** (*Lobelia cardinalis*) is a native plant of North, South, and Central America, normally found in moist areas such as streams, swamps, and low-wooded areas.

- Attracts hummingbirds
- Likes full sun, but does well with afternoon shade
- Loves rich, moist to wet soil
- Hardy with few pests & diseases; common pest are slugs and snails
- Deer resistant
- Toxic to human and pets

Information about the Cardinal Flower and Swamp Milkweed were taken from theSpruce.com.

**Swamp milkweed** is a member of the milkweed family.

- Beloved by bees and butterflies
- Critical host for monarch butterflies.
- Deer and rabbit resistant once matured
- Does well in moist clay soil

The blooms of swamp milkweed come in shades of soft mauve to pink to reddish-violet or occasionally white. Five nectar cups form a crown on five small petals, ideal for intricate pollination. By autumn, narrow pods reveal flat brown seeds attached to the white tufts characteristic of all milkweeds.

Like most milkweed species, swamp milkweed is clump-forming. Sturdy, upright clumps grow on stems four to five feet tall and two to three feet wide. Leaves grow in pairs, stiff, taper-pointed, and lance-shaped. Sometimes the edges of a leaf turn inward and upward. Milkweed is toxic to humans and pets.



An equal amount of each plant will be ordered. Plants will be given out on a first come, first serve basis. If you favor one specific plant over another, please come at the start of the event. Once they are given out, that is it.

Please join the CA's Weed Warriors on Saturday July 6th, 9-11am to remove invasive plants in our community's first Adopt-A-Spot. Invasive plants cause damage to our ecosystem by displacing and out competing native plants that support our native wildlife and pollinators.

Meet in the grassy field by the playground on Grey Rock Rd (across the street from Fragile Sail Way). Gloves, tools, and instruction will be provided. Please bring water and consider wearing a hat, long sleeves, pants, and comfortable close-toed shoes, for protection from sun, ticks, thorns, poison ivy etc.

The Howard County Bureau of Highways is responsible for pavement, sidewalks, storm drains, trees, and over 970 miles of county roads for the convenience and safety of the public. **Traffic Engineering Division**...This division is responsible for traffic signals, streetlight installation, street signs, and traffic calming and safety. 410-313-2430.

**Street Signs**...The Sign and Marking Division is responsible for all existing street signs and pavement markings. To report damaged or down sign, contact 410-313-7450. To inquire about the installation of a new sign, contact 410-313-2430.

**To Report a Highway Maintenance** concern such as road condition, sidewalks, storm drainage or street trees, contact the Highways Operations Division at 410-313-7450 or by email: [highways@howardcountymd.gov](mailto:highways@howardcountymd.gov).

**To Report a Traffic Control** concerns such as intersection safety, traffic calming, street lights and miss-timed traffic signal or school flasher, contact the Traffic Engineering Division at 410-313-2430 or by email: [traffic@howardcountymd.gov](mailto:traffic@howardcountymd.gov).

**Bulk Trash Items:** Residents receiving County-provided curbside trash collection are eligible for curbside bulk trash and metal collection. Residents in private areas that do not receive County collection are not eligible for bulk pickup. Remember: Bulk trash items collected by the County will be sent to a landfill. Residents may call 410-313-6444. Large trash items (individual items which do not fit in trash cans) such as mattresses, box springs, chairs, sofas, dressers and tables will be collected. Place these items at the curb on your regular trash day. Maximum of 4 large trash items will be collected per pick-up. Items must be able to be lifted by two collection crew members (larger items will be tagged and left for the resident's disposal). Bulk metal items include metal swing sets, file cabinets, appliances, lawn mowers, exercise equipment, etc. must be scheduled. Please remove doors from refrigerators, and drain oil and gas from lawn mowers. Please go to:

**Yard Trim Collection:** Howard County offers yard trim collection on the same day as recycling collection. Do not use plastic bags for your yard trim—it will not be collected. Use paper bags or reusable containers without lids only. Howard County offers the “**Feed the Green Bin**” program in our Village. ## Play Equipment

This is a friendly reminder that play equipment should be stored at the rear of the house. Not only in your backyard, but in the rear lines of the home. Definition of rear lines: Using the rear corner of the house, draw an imaginary straight line to your rear property line. The area, in between the imaginary lines behind the house, is considered to be the rear lines of the house. If you are looking to keep play equipment in the front yard, we ask that you submit an exterior alteration application for the equipment.

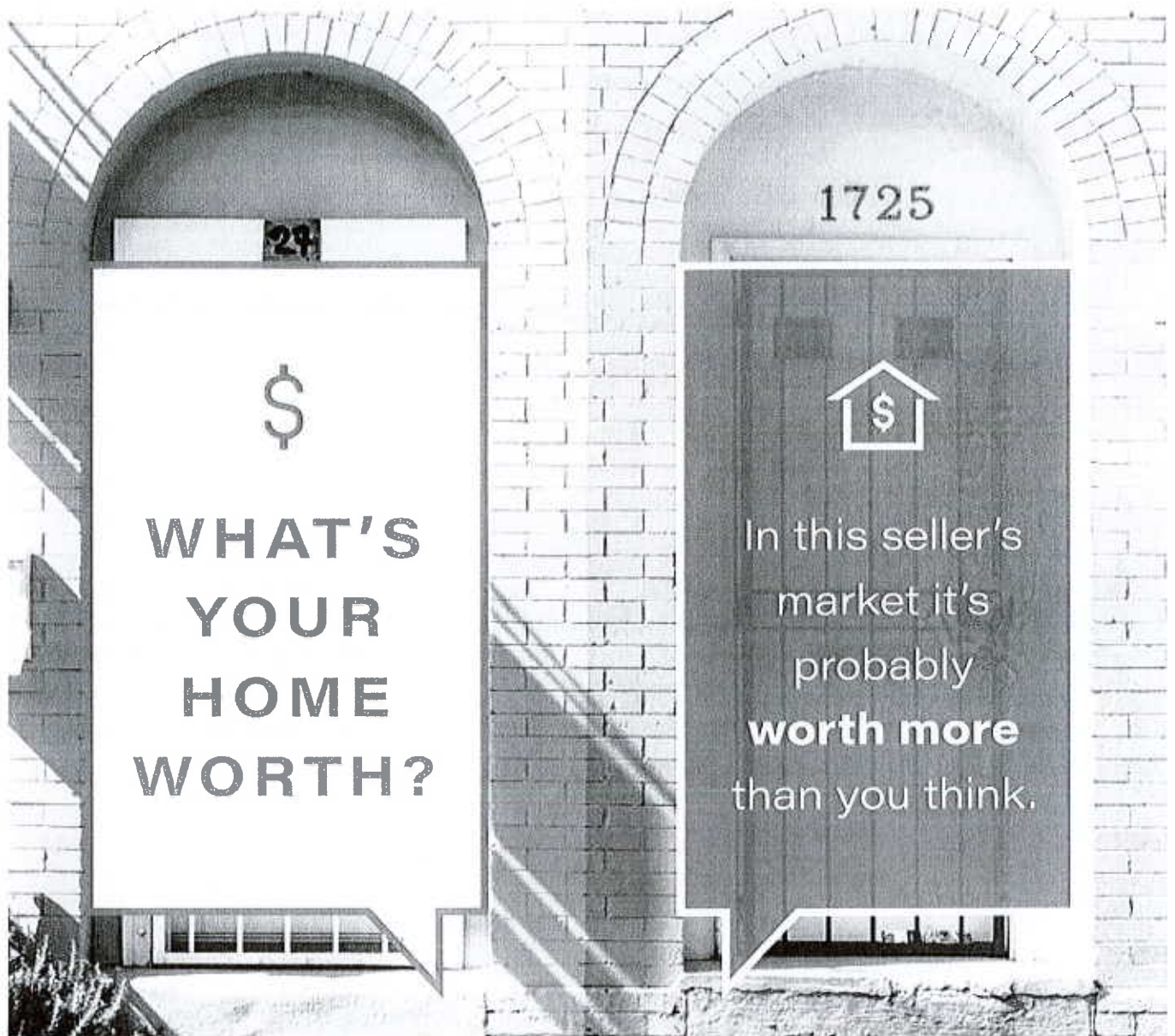
