## Village Election on Saturday, April 26

Absentee Balloting will take place from Tuesday, April 1—Thursday, April 24, 2024. You may come to the Village Office to cast your Absentee Ballot or you may call the Village office to have one mailed to you. The resident must mail the ballot back or return it to Linden Hall by Thursday, April 24 before close of business which is 7pm. Your sealed ballot may be placed in the black exterior mailbox located at the parking lot entrance door. The sealed ballot will be collected by staff and transferred to the ballot box. Only Election Committee members may open the ballot to verify voting qualifications and vote counting.

## Columbia Cleans

Every year the Columbia Villages and Columbia Association select a date for a Columbia Wide Clean Up. This year, the date is **Saturday, April 5 from 9am—noon**. We ask that volunteers sign up and help keep the public use areas of our village clean. We have two routes which will take our volunteers onto County and CA pathways. Each route will have one tot lot area which is apart of the cleanup.

I am proud to say that our Village does a good job with keeping litter/trash off of our public use spaces, but trash can still be found in the wooded areas just off of the pathways. To help with litter/trash out of our public use spaces, have secure, tight fitting lids on your cans. If you leave a trash bag with food scraps in it and it is NOT placed in a can, the birds or other type of animals can rip open the bag and make a mess by the curb. Stormwater will take that garbage down the storm drain which leads into our beautiful wooded areas in our neighborhood. Please clean up the mess as soon as you can.

We meet at the Dorsey Hall pool parking lot at 9am. Donuts, Coffee, and water will be available, along with a map of the routes, instructions, garbage bags, gloves, and trash grabbers.

Tickets must be picked up in advance-there are no tickets available at the door, since caterers need an exact headcount before hand. If you picked up free tickets and cannot attend an event, please return to the village office as soon as possible so you can be taken off the headcount and allow a wait-listed family to attend. Staff may require ID in order to verify residency; please do not send children to pick up tickets, since they are not included on the resident list. Family or Children's events must have an adult accompanying a child. Tickets may still be available when the newsletter is being printed, but may be sold out before you receive your issue. 



Who is eligible to vote: There is one vote per property and the property must be in compliance with the covenants. To cast a ballot, the individual must be a property owner or tenant (tenants must have proof of residency, e.g. drivers license, utility bill, lease) as of March 1, 2025. Please call the office to have an absentee ballot mailed to you. Your name will be matched to "The List of Members" as is stated in By-Law Section 1.08 List of Members. A completed ballot may be placed in our exterior mailbox, mailed, or brought to the office no later than Thursday, April 24 by close of business.

No Absentee Ballots may leave the office unless the member requests it to be mailed to them. If you are a tenant, supporting documents must be viewed to ensure membership as stated in Article 6 in the Dorsey's Search Articles of Incorporation.

One vote per property: Article 7—Section B, "such members will collectively be entitled to one vote relative to the lot, unit, share, membership or other interest, and if such members cannot jointly agree as to how that vote should be cast, no vote shall be allowed with respect to such lot, unit, .....".

Purple Coneflower

Echinacea purpurea

This perennial favorite is hardy, drought tolerant and long blooming. The coneflower grows to a height of 3-5' depending on the conditions and attracts birds, bees and butterflies.

#### Where to plant:

This summer – fall flower loves full sun and well drained soil. Plant in a spot that gets at least 6-8 hours of full sunlight. The plants can tolerate partial shade, but they may flop over and not bloom as prolifically as in full sun

#### Deer proof:

It is said that Coneflowers are not eaten by the deer, but the deer in Dorsey seem to love the blooms!

#### Pruning:

Deadheading (removing the dead flowers) is recommended to keep them in bloom all summer. The plant does not need to be cut back in winter for the dried seeds provide food for the birds. Come Spring, the dried plants should be cut to ground level to allow for the new growth.



Red Columbine

Aquilegia Canadensis

A delicate native flower is very easy to grow and loved by hummingbirds. Its main pollinator is the Ruby-Throated hummingbird. The mature columbine is short, under 3 feet in height. They can spread easily when their seeds are allowed to drop.

#### Where to plant:

This spring flower does best in part sun to full shade and in well drained soil. It can tolerate full sun, but will need some help to get established there. Hillsides, rock garden and sloping gardens are perfect places for this flower. Once it has been established after the first year, this flower requires minimal care and is drought tolerant.

#### Deer proof:

It is said that Red Columbine are not eaten by the deer! **Beware** it is poisonous. All parts of the plant/flower can cause mild illness if ingested by adults, children and pets. Symptoms of poisoning include vomiting and diarrhea.

#### Pruning:

Once the blooms have left and the plants become brown, cut down to ground level to promote new growth the following Spring.



The Perennial Plant Association, recently announced that 'Jeana", a new cultivar of the garden phlox (Phlox paniculta), was named its 2024 Plant of the Year. This grand version, stands an impressive five feet tall and four feet wide. With showy lavender-pink flowers, it blooms from midsummer into early fall. The plant is especially attractive to humming-birds, butterflies, especially the eastern tiger swallowtails and other beneficial pollinators. This variety bridges the gap between early summer and later blooming perennials. However, it performs best with regular deadheading. Another benefit to this variety, is that it is highly resistant to the scourge of powdery mildew that plaques many summer phlox varieties. 'Jeana' has won acclaim in various plant trials, including at the Mt Cuba Center in Delaware. "Phlox paniculate 'Jeana' was hands-down a top performer in Mt. Cuba Centers' trail and continues to be a powerhouse in our gardens," says George Coombs, Mt. Cuba's director of horticulture. Mr. Coombs goes on to say, "Not only does it remain sturdy and disease free in all season long, but the beautiful floral display attracts more butterflies than any other phlox we have ever grown."

In our continuing quest to attract beneficial pollinators to our gardens, this new variety, if you have the space, will be an excellent addition.

## **Weed Warriors**

IT TAKES A VILLAGE! A Village like Dorsey Search can make an environmental difference by removing invasive weeds. So, let's gather on Saturday, April 26, to pull the invasive Garlic Mustard along the Little Patuxent River path. Families, Scouts, neighbors, relatives, school groups, etc. are all invited to this event. (We can sign off on volunteer hours; just bring you paperwork). The times can be either 9-11 AM or 1-3 PM or both, weather permitting. Columbia Association will provide large plastic bags, tools, gloves and instructions. There are 3 supply points manned by volunteers that we would like to focus on: 1) at the beginning of the path on Columbia Road on the opposite the pool; 2) on Larkspring Row cul-de-sac, which is the end of the path; 3) the middle of the river path, where another path leads to the tot lot on Columbia Road. Look for flags to locate these spots at the beginning/end and along the path we are weeding. Please bring back what you borrow to a volunteer. Also, please bring water and consider wearing a hat, gloves, long sleeves, pants, and comfortable close-toed shoes for protection from sun, ticks, thorns, poison ivy etc. This event is being organized by Weed Warrior Volunteer Leaders, Sandy Thompson and Megan Gratz. Bulk Trash Items: Residents receiving County-provided curbside trash collection are eligible for curbside bulk trash and metal collection. Residents in private areas that do not receive County collection are not eligible for bulk pickup. Remember: Bulk trash items collected by the County will be sent to a landfill. Residents may call 410-313-6444. Large trash items (individual items which do not fit in trash cans) such as mattresses, box springs, chairs, sofas, dressers and tables will be collected. Place these items at the curb on your regular trash day. Maximum of 4 large trash items will be collected per pick-up. Items must be able to be lifted by two collection crew members (larger items will be tagged and left for the resident's disposal). Bulk metal items include metal swing sets, file cabinets, appliances, lawn mowers, exercise equipment, etc. must be scheduled. Please remove doors from refrigerators, and drain oil and gas from lawn mowers. Please go to:

## Cul—de-Sac Beautification

The Dorsey's Search Community Association has decided to grant money towards the beautification of 2 cul-de-sacs in the Village. Each grant will be \$250. Once the Village reviews and approves the plan, the application will be sent to the County for their consideration. The applicant will be notified once the County approves the plan. Only then can items be purchased for the project. To receive the \$250 reimbursement, submit all original receipts to the Village Office by July 15, 2025. No exceptions. An application is on the next page, but will also be available at the Village Office or online at: https://www.dorseyssearch.org/wp-content/uploads/2025/02/CulDeSacApp.pdf. The Village will start accepting applications on March 3, 2025.

The following items are required by the County:

- Picture of the cul-de-sac
- Petition signed by 80% of residents in the cul-de-sac
- Proposed planting plan, drawing
- List of specific plants to be used

The Village and County will not be responsible for what is planted in the cul-de-sac. Residents must agree to the upkeep of the cul-de-sac which may include mulching every year. As a reminder, you may NOT have plants that will grow and block the visibility through the island and you may NOT have plants that will grow into the roadway.




