Columbia Card

What's a Columbia Card?

The Columbia Card gives residents access to CA facilities at a discounted, pay-as-you-go rate. Here is an example:

Visit the pool for non-residents and residents without a Columbia Card is \$24 for an adult Monday—Friday. If you have a Columbia Card, it is only \$8.

Who can get one?

Anyone who lives on CA-assessed property can get one. They are completely free!

How do you get it?

You can fill out the application online (must upload documentation proving residency) or call customer care at 410-730-1801, option 6 and they'll talk you through it.

Don't get caught paying the non-resident rate for CA facilities! You pay your CPRA; you are entitled to discounts! Get your Columbia Card!

Guidelines

In the Village of Dorsey's Search, we have Guidelines and Covenants. These are two different documents. Don't be confused. Let's focus on the Guidelines.

The guidelines "guide" the residents with exterior changes or maintenance issues pertaining to the property. It's always a good idea to review the guidelines before making changes to your property. This will help formulate how to apply for the exterior alteration or how to proceed with maintaining your property. The guidelines can be found on our website:

Besides information about individual exterior alterations, it explains the application procedure, appeal procedures for denial of an application, letter of compliance procedures, the covenant enforcement process, general guidelines, important numbers before you need to dig, and the Howard County Animal Control phone number for any type of animal complaint.

Each property is unique, so you may find that some guidelines might not apply to your property. Our Covenant Advisor will help you with any questions you might have about exterior alteration changes. Anne is here to guide our residents, as well as, our Residential Architectural Committee (RAC).

Things to remember:

Over the summer, while I was in Maine, I was able to visit a friend's lavender patch. In her backyard, behind the barn and under the bright, blue sky of summer, were a dozen rows of purple blooming lavender. We walked along the paths between the rows and marveled at the scent that waffled in the air and commented on the number of docile bees that went plant to plant, ignoring our presence.

During our walk together, she revealed some interesting facts about this herbal plant.

Lavender has been a staple in gardens for eons. The plant seems to have originated in the middle east and India. From the beginning, it has always been used for fragrant, medicinal and religious purposes. Ancient Romans uses it to scent their communal baths. It has been used for embalming, cosmetics, as an insecticide as well as an additive to foods. Lavender is a natural repellent for mosquitoes, flies and even deer. The name is derived from the Latin word 'larva' meaning to wash or cleanse. During the medieval period, it was deemed the 'herb of love' and used as an aphrodisiac but not before it was used to ward off disease, like the bubonic plague. Queen Victoria, loved this herb so much that throughout her reign, she was instrumental in promoting London as a major city for the production of lavender products. Publicity helped to boost the Yardley of London brand during that time and even today Yardley remains a popular trademark for lavender soaps and fragrances.

If you're considering growing lavender and are trying to determine which variety is right for you, it can be a bit overwhelming to find that there are over 47 species of lavender. To bring this large number down to size, there are basically 3 types to consider; *English Lavender*, which has the stronger scent, *French Lavender*, which is used in oils and *Spanish Lavender*, which is noted for their unique form.

While walking along the lavender rows I thought about what I would need to successfully grow lavender here in Maryland. My friend told me that lavender needs sun and a lot of it; 6 to 8 hours a day. It likes drier conditions and prefers an alkaline soil mix. Alkaline soil is high in mineral content and not suitable for most garden plants, but lavender is an exception. You can improve soil by mixing in sand, gravel and perlite to ensure good drainage. Most important is that lavender does well when they are planted in raised mounds. This creates less water retention around the roots.

So, if you have a sunny, dry area in your yard with a Ph level of 7 or above, lavender might be the plant for you. Joan Oliver, Dorsey Hall Garden Club

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

Bulk Trash Items: Residents receiving County-provided curbside trash collection are eligible for curbside bulk trash and metal collection. Residents in private areas that do not receive County collection are not eligible for bulk pickup. Remember: Bulk trash items collected by the County will be sent to a landfill. Residents may call 410-313-6444. Large trash items (individual items which do not fit in trash cans) such as mattresses, box springs, chairs, sofas, dressers and tables will be collected. Place these items at the curb on your regular trash day. Maximum of 4 large trash items will be collected per pick-up. Items must be able to be lifted by two collection crew members (larger items will be tagged and left for the resident's disposal). Bulk metal items include metal swing sets, file cabinets, appliances, lawn mowers, exercise equipment, etc. must be scheduled. 
