The dates listed in the presentation await final approval from the state. If approved, there will be 6 archery hunts spanning from October to January. Signs will be posted at the entrances listing the dates the area will be closed. Hunting only occurs from sunrise to 11am. According to County officials, there is an overpopulation of white-tail deer in this area of Open Space next to our Village neighborhood of Dorsey Hall.

Tree giveaway form on page 6. The Village and Columbia Association are able to supply trees to our residents. Here is the guideline on how you can protect your trees from the deer and not be in violation of the guideline.

Guideline No. 18A– Gardens: Flower and/or Vegetable, Deer Fencing

DEER/ANIMAL FENCING – A system of webbing and posts manufactured specifically for the protection of plants from deer and to have minimal visual impact. The webbing is stranded plastic mesh and black. This material is used to protect larger permanent plants/landscaping, such as evergreens. This is intended to be temporary to allow plants to establish or to recover. This is not intended as a permanent solution for damage caused by deer. Other species of plants may need to be considered if substantial damage continues. Deer/animal fencing is prohibited as property line fencing or sectioning off areas of the property. It is to be used as a protective barrier for plants only.

No Exterior Alteration Application is required if the following criteria are met:

1. The plants to be wrapped are within the rear lines of the house.
2. The deer/animal fencing is low visibility, black, fine mesh
3. Plants are individually wrapped or close groupings of plants are wrapped
4. The fencing does not exceed the height of 7 feet

An annual Exterior Alteration Application is required if:

1. The deer/animal fencing is to be placed in the side/front yard or outside the rear lines of the house.
2. The chosen fencing is not low visibility, black, fine mesh.
3. The fencing is taller than 7 feet.

Please get your forms in early if you are interested in obtaining a tree. **Deadline** for submission Wednesday **August 19, 2026**.

Why this is important? Planting a tree helps with reducing carbon dioxide, soil health, biodiversity support to wildlife and ecosystems, and temperature moderation.

Trees will be available for pick up on Saturday, September 26 from 8am—11:00am at Linden Hall (4765 Dorsey Hall Drive, Ellicott City).

Quick facts on the Native Trees and shrub for the Giveaway

Native trees and shrubs provide food, shelter, and nesting habitat for birds, butterflies, bees, and other wildlife. They are well adapted to our local climate and generally require less maintenance once established.

EASTERN REDBUD (*CERCIS CANADENSIS*)

One of the first signs of spring, Eastern Redbud produces vibrant pink flowers before its heart-shaped leaves emerge.

Mature Size: 20–30' tall × 25–35' wide

Sun: Full sun to partial shade

Features: Early spring blooms, attractive foliage, small ornamental tree

Wildlife Value: Supports native bees and butterflies; seeds are eaten by songbirds.

FLOWERING DOGWOOD (*CORNUS FLORIDA*)

A beloved native tree known for its showy white spring flowers, brilliant red fall foliage, and bright red berries.

Mature Size: 15–30' tall × 15–30' wide

Sun: Partial shade to full sun

Features: Spring flowers, fall color, ornamental berries

Wildlife Value: Fruits provide food for numerous bird species and other wildlife.

SWEETBAY MAGNOLIA (*MAGNOLIA VIRGINIANA*)

This graceful native tree produces fragrant, creamy-white flowers from late spring into summer and thrives in moist areas.

Mature Size: 10–35' tall × 10–20' wide

Sun: Full sun to partial shade

Features: Lemon-scented flowers, glossy leaves, adaptable to wet soils

Wildlife Value: Attracts pollinators and serves as a host plant for the Eastern Tiger Swallowtail butterfly.

ARROWWOOD VIBURNUM (*VIBURNUM DENTATUM*) SHRUB

A versatile native shrub with clusters of white flowers in spring and blue-black berries in late summer.

Mature Size: 6–10' tall × 6–10' wide

Sun: Full sun to partial shade

Features: Spring blooms, colorful fall foliage, excellent screening plant

Wildlife Value: Berries are highly valued by birds, while flowers attract pollinators.

WHITE OAK (*QUERCUS ALBA*)

One of the most important native trees for wildlife, White Oak provides beauty, shade, and ecological benefits for generations.

Mature Size: 50–80' tall × 50–80' wide

Sun: Full sun

Features: Broad shade canopy, impressive fall color, long lifespan

Wildlife Value: Supports hundreds of insect species and produces acorns that feed birds and mammals.

If you have space, this would be great tree to add to your property.

Why Plant Native?

Native plants help:

- Support pollinators and birds
- Improve biodiversity
- Reduce maintenance needs
- Strengthen local ecosystems
- Create beautiful, sustainable landscapes

Important Numbers

Take a picture of the problem. Use the TellHoCo App which is an app that can be downloaded onto your cell phone. TellHoCo may also be accessed by visiting the County website at: www.howardcountymd.gov. When using the County website, type in the search bar Tell HoCo, select Tell HoCo, this will bring you to the submission page. During the submission process, it will ask if you want to submit a picture. You don't have to have one have to have a picture, but it is always good to pinpoint your issue.

Traffic Engineering Division...This division is responsible for traffic signals, streetlight installation, street signs, and traffic calming and safety. 410-313-2430.

Street Signs...The Sign and Marking Division is responsible for all existing street signs and pavement markings. To report damaged or down sign, contact 410-313-7450. To inquire about the installation of a new sign, contact 410-313-2430.

To Report a Highway Maintenance concern such as road condition, **sidewalks**, storm drainage or street trees, contact the Highways Operations Division at 410-313-7450 or by email: highways@howardcountymd.gov.

To Report a Traffic Control concerns such as intersection safety, traffic calming, street lights and miss-timed traffic signal or school flasher, contact the Traffic Engineering Division at 410-313-2430 or by email: traffic@howardcountymd.gov.

Trash and Recycling Pick-up: there are holidays that the County has moved pick up to a slide schedule. If you have further questions, please Call 410-313-6444 or visit their website at: www.howardcountymd.gov/holidayschedule
All trash and recycling cans should be removed from the street on the pick-up day and stored out of sight.

Yard Trim Collection: Howard County offers yard trim collection on the same day as recycling collection. Do not use plastic bags for your yard trim—it will not be collected. Use paper bags or reusable containers without lids only. Howard County offers the "Feed the Green Bin" program in our Village. Bulk Trash Items: Residents receiving County-provided curbside trash collection are eligible for curbside bulk trash and metal collection. Residents in private areas that do not receive County collection are not eligible for bulk pickup. Remember: Bulk trash items collected by the County will be sent to a landfill. Residents may call 410-313-6444. Large trash items (individual items which do not fit in trash cans) such as mattresses, box springs, chairs, sofas, dressers and tables will be collected. Place these items at the curb on your regular trash day. Maximum of 4 large trash items will be collected per pick-up. Items must be able to be lifted by two collection crew members (larger items will be tagged and left for the resident's disposal). Bulk metal items include metal swing sets, file cabinets, appliances, lawn mowers, exercise equipment, etc. must be scheduled. Please remove doors from refrigerators, and drain oil and gas from lawn mowers. Please go to:

Document Shredding

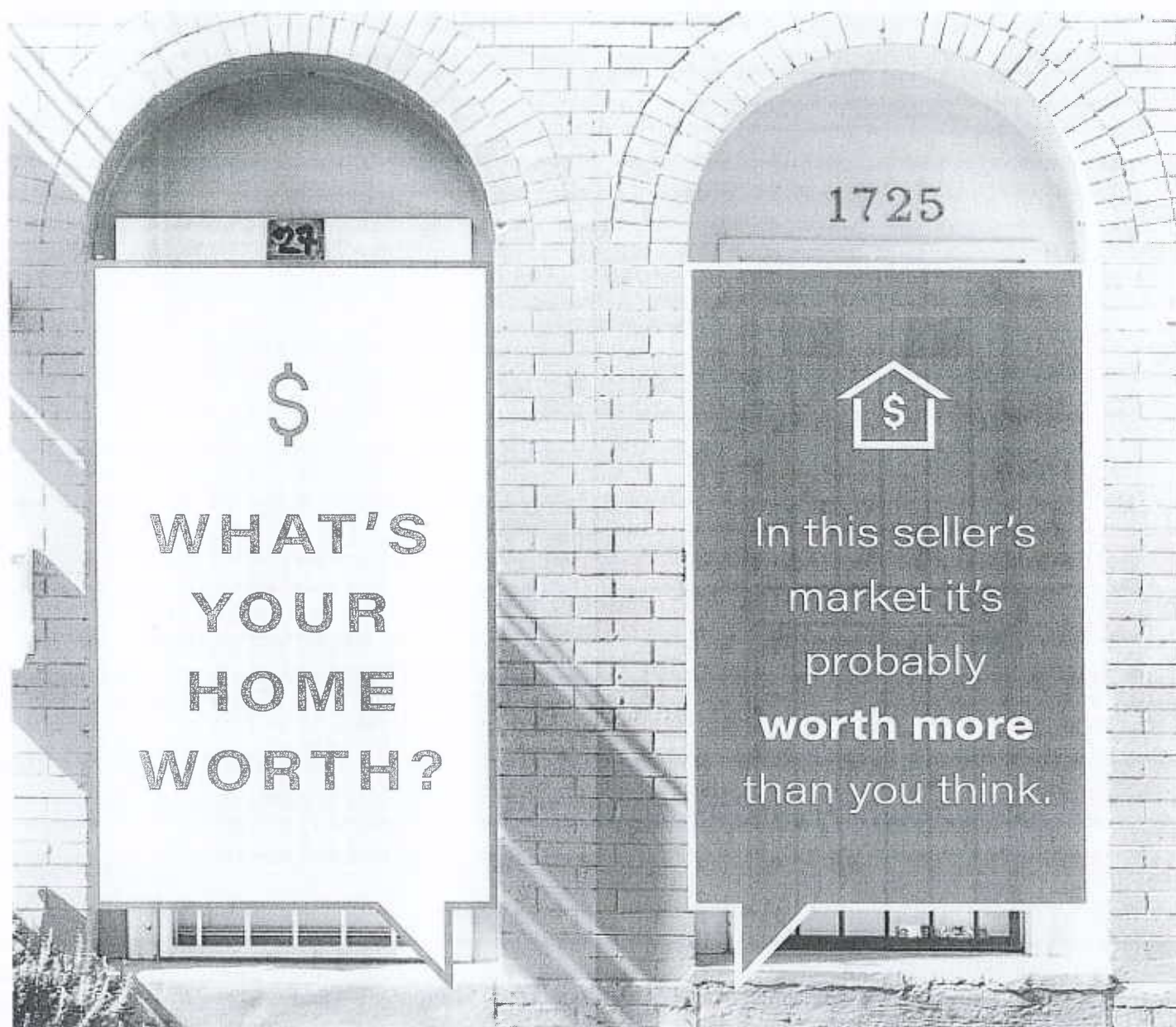
Saturday, October 10 from 9—noon.
